


After these speeches from Moroccan officials, Mr. Groarke, and Dr. Boutjdir, the audience split into 4 workshops where project holders presented their projects in 4 thematic areas of interest to the Moroccan Government. These thematic areas were 1) Industry and New Technologies, 2) Education, Higher Education, and Scientific Research, 3) Renewable Energies and Environmental Protection, and 4) Human Development. The total number of projects presented by the Moroccan-American Diaspora was 51 with 12 projects in Industry and New Technologies, 21 projects in Education, Higher Education, and Scientific Research, 8 projects in Renewable Energies and Environmental Protection, and 10 projects in Human Development. It is noteworthy to mention that representatives of the Moroccan Government spoke at the beginning of each workshop and gave an overview of priorities for the government in those areas of critical need. After the workshops, the meeting reconvened and moderators presented their reports about the projects to the general audience. Further discussion and a Q&A session have been held to hear from the audience especially from the representatives of the Moroccan Government.

A follow up Forum will be organized in Morocco at the end of February or beginning of March 2013. Before this meeting, the Moroccan government will select the projects that best fit its economic needs and call the project holders to the February-March forum. During this forum, project holders from the AMCN will give more details about their projects, how they will carry them, and be partnered with interested parties in Morocco.

The Forum was followed up by an AMCN meeting on June 24th where the members of the network elected the AMCN officers as follows: President: Dr. Mohamed Boutjdir; Vice-President: Amine Chigani; Secretary: Nadia Serhani-Eltobgi; Treasurer: Houda Rabah. Other Board Members include Dr. Tahar El-Korchi, Hanan Chaibanou, Saad Zouak, Mohamed Belkhat, Leila Hanafi, Hafida Torres, Dr. Abdelmajid Kassem, Yazid Boutejdi and Loubna Ennadir.
